Alberta House is an interactive exhibit showcasing skills, trades and technology opportunities in Alberta during WorldSkills Calgary 2009 with themed displays on learning, working, innovating, living and visiting in Alberta. WorldSkills Calgary 2009 mascots “Tug” and “Tess” will mingle with visitors in Alberta House every day about 10 a.m., 1 p.m., and 4 p.m. Other highlights include a 3D fly-through of the human body and hands-on airplane flight simulation.
